Biography

Cara-Ann Simpson is an artist, curator, educator, and consultant, with a background across arts, heritage, tourism, conservation, arts, and festival sectors. She is a multidisciplinary artist exploring sensory perception, deep listening, memory, and identity. Simpson's lived experience of disability informs her practice, which is reflective in recent work (since 2018). As an arts and cultural heritage worker, she has led organisations, provided leadership, and curatorial expertise in Queensland and Victoria. Simpson is committed to regional Australia, and supporting regional artists through professional development and mentoring. She has received numerous grants for her creative projects, as well as recognitions for her artwork and contribution to the arts and culture sector. Simpson has exhibited broadly in Australia and internationally, including complex interactive installation developed with technical collaborators. Simpson's work is held in public and private collections in Australia and internationally including Hahndorf Academy, Darebin City Council, Toowoomba Regional Council, Albury City Council, and Alroe Solicitors.
